Answers to FAQs.

1. Hopeful Hearts volunteers carry out home visits prior to every requested adoption.
2. Hopeful Hearts provides only high-end dog food for its rescues i.e. Fromm, Orijen etc.
3. Our volunteers pay their own cell phone expenses.
4. All board members have full-time jobs.

5. Hopeful Hearts has no paid staff.
6. All food, veterinary costs and required supplies are provided free of charge to our foster homes.
7. Hopeful Hearts has a Guardian Angel program for donors who wish to donate on a pre-arranged monthly basis towards the care of our palliative dogs.
8. Hopeful Hearts' dogs are adopted by loving families across Canada and now the United States! Our furthest adoption was in Vancouver.
9. Hopeful Hearts works with many reputable rescues that share its philosophies, ethics and mission to provide protective, stable environments and using a rigorous screening process, find and place dogs in permanent and loving adoptive homes.
